New Library Update

It is time to move forward with the new library! The library has hired an owner's representative - Geoff Vine of Vine Consulting - to assist with the project. Now it is time to continue the design by engaging the services of an architect and engineer. This is anticipated to be approved in September.

While the schedule for building the new library has not yet been finalized, construction on the new library is expected to begin in 2022. The project budget will be over \$12 million. This includes the \$10 million from the Village of Oregon and more than \$2.1 million in donations from the community, along with available impact fees. Sincere thanks to all those who have contributed to make this possible!

The new library is expected to be around 33,000 square feet is hoped to include expanded space for all ages along with gathering spaces including a study rooms, a storytime room and a community room, to start.

What are we offering at the Library?

The library is open and has returned to our pre-pandemic hours. In-person services include browsing, holds pick-up, computer use, notary services by appointment, 24/7 outdoor book drop, free Wi-Fi available inside and outside the building, Wi-Fi printing, and copier services.

Monarch Butterfly Biology and Conservation

Thursday, October 21 at 6:30 pm

Monarch butterfly populations have been declining over the last 20 years. It is important to move beyond documenting this decline and toward responding to the challenge posed by monarch and insect conservation. In this presentation, Karen Oberhauser will describe the amazing biology of migratory monarchs, how citizens and scientists are documenting monarch numbers across their migratory cycle, and what the Arboretum and other organizations are doing, and what you can do to preserve this charismatic insect for generations to come.

Author Visit - Dead Lines: Slices of Life from the Obit Beat

Meet the author of Dead Lines: Slices of Life from the Obit Beat. This book is a lively collection of feature obituaries and related news stories of longtime newspaper reporter and local resident, George Hesselberg. Digging deeper, he uncovered the extraordinary among the ordinary, memorializing the lives of a sword designer, a radio villain, a pioneering female detective, a homeless woman who spoke fluent French, a beloved classroom tarantula, and many more. Their stories are alternately amusing, sad, surprising, and profound. Together they speak to a shared human experience and inspire us to see the people around us with new eyes, valuing the lives while they are still being lived.

GEORGE HESSELBERG was a reporter for the Wisconsin State Journal for forty-three years. He covered every beat, wrote hundreds of news obituaries of the famous and the not-so-famous, and was a columnist for eighteen years. Hesselberg, a UW-Madison and University of Oslo graduate, earned national and state awards for his investigative reporting and feature writing at the State Journal. This is Hesselberg's fifth book.
