

2019 Sew What?!

Lavender Sachets

Having a busy summer? Relax, take a step back in time to create a lavender sachet, decorated with Sashiko, a form of Japanese hand stitching. We'll start with the handwork, following the preprinted pattern, then finish with the sewing machine. Don't let the handwork scare you away- the stitching lines make it fun & easy! You can do this! Finished size is 4" square.

When: Saturday, July 20, 2019 at 9:30am
(start setting up at 9am)

Registration required.

For beginners, ages 9- adult (kids ages 9-12 MUST have an adult stay to help them)

Skills you'll learn: Sashiko hand stitching

Supplies you need to bring to make ONE sachet ---

- Navy thread and one bobbin
- Scissors for cutting fabric
- Pins
- Seam ripper
- A hand sewing needle (to sew up the open seam)
- If you bring your sewing machine- check to make sure it's in working order, and bring your instruction manual

The library will provide -

- Preprinted fabric, backing, dried lavender & rice (for filling the sachets)
- White Sashiko thread & special hand sewing needles
- Irons & ironing boards
- Rotary cutters, mats & rulers
- Extra sewing machines
